

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Internship (IINE-Boston)

IINE is currently offering an English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) internship through its Boston office to students with demonstrated interest or experience in serving refugee, asylee, and immigrant populations. IINE's English for Speakers of Other Languages Program serves clients ages 18+ who are committed to taking their next college and career steps in the United States. The program's four levels of ESOL classes serve approximately 15 clients per class. Class levels are High Beginner SPL0-2 (Student Performance/Proficiency Level), Pre-Intermediate SPL3-4, Intermediate SPL 4-5, and Advanced SPL 5-6+. The Evening ESOL program offers coaching, advising, and career pathway guidance to help clients achieve their next steps. ESOL is taught in a College and Career Readiness context. Interns serve as coaches to help clients get jobs, get better jobs, enter training programs, or further their education. Classes meet every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings from 6-9pm, and run from September until June. The program is student-centered and experiential. ESOL classes are held in the evening, semesters run from September through June.

Time Commitment:

A minimum commitment of 20 hours per week is required.
Days are flexible depending on student schedule and internship manager needs.

Key Responsibilities:

Intern responsibilities include:

- Conducting weekly information sessions,
- Coaching students on career, education, and civic engagement goals
- Assisting teachers with instruction in classrooms
- Providing general administrative assistance to the ESOL Program teams

Qualifications:

In addition to the qualifications listed for all IINE internships, those applying for an ESOL Program internship should have the following qualifications:

- Experience in multicultural environments

- Experience teaching or tutoring adult learners
- Experience or educational background in TESL
- Language skills in Arabic, French, Spanish. Chinese, Portuguese, and Napoli preferred
