## Protect Refugees and Honor Humanitarian Commitments in the FY26 Appropriations Budget

- **Maintain and strengthen funding** for Migration and Refugee Assistance (MRA), International Disaster Assistance (IDA), and Emergency Refugee and Migration Assistance (ERMA),
- **Include bill language** to ensure displaced people have access to food, education, housing, and long-term solutions like resettlement,
- **Support local communities** in welcoming newcomers through the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR),
- **Ensure full funding for USCIS** to support refugee and asylum processing — independently from enforcement or detention funding,
- **Defend humanitarian protections** by ensuring individuals with parole, Temporary Protected Status (TPS), or pending protection applications are not left vulnerable to sudden policy changes.

Only Congress can make the refugee protection system stable, efficient, and fair. Thank you for standing up for U.S. leadership, safety, and humanitarian values.
